

Session I What Every Ministry Needs!

Who Is the Church?

Definition of the Church. The New Testament word for "church" is ekklesia [ἐκκλησία], which means <u>"the called</u> out ones." In classical Greek, the term was used almost exclusively for political gatherings. In particular, in Athens the word signified the assembling of the citizens for the purpose of conducting the affairs of the polis. Moreover, ekklesia referred only to the actual meeting, not to the citizens themselves. When the people were not assembled, they were not considered to be the ekklesia. The New Testament records three instances of this secular usage of the term (Acts 19:32,39,41).

Who Is the Church?

When we come to the New Testament, we discover that ekklesia [ἐκκλησία] is used of the community of God's people some 109 times (out of 114 occurrences of the term).

- *2 times in Gospels (<u>Matt 16:18</u>; <u>18:17</u>),
- *23 times in Acts
- *46 times in Pauline writings
- *20 times in Revelations

Who Is the Church?

Conclusions:

- 1. First, predominantly *ekklesia* applies to a local assembly of those who profess faith in and allegiance to Christ.
- 2. Second, *ekklesia* designates the universal church (<u>Acts 8:3</u>; <u>9:31</u>; <u>1 Cor 12:28</u>; <u>15:9</u>; especially in the later Pauline letters, <u>Eph 1:22-23</u>; <u>Col 1:18</u>).
- 3. Third, the *ekklesia* is *God's* congregation (<u>1 Cor</u> <u>1:2</u>; <u>2 Cor 1:1</u>; etc.).

The Purpose

The Christian Church, at its root, has a two-fold purpose:

- 1. To Save The Lost (John 3:16, Matt 5:13-16)
- 2. To Perfect (Mature) the Saved. (Eph 4:2-16)
 - ➤ (Depicted in our two major Sacraments: Baptism {Romans 6:3-6} and Communion {I Cor 10:16})
 - > All other ministry should support these two core objectives.

Consider...

And I will give you pastors according to mine heart, which shall feed you with knowledge and understanding.

Jeremiah 3:15

The Pastor (the Visionary) is given by God to the Church

- ➤ Promises: v16-Increase in the number or followers, v.17-Glory, Fame, and Salvation, v.18-Unity and Blessing, v.19-Blessing upon the Pastor ...
- *If the church will allow the Pastor to feed you with knowledge and understanding

Consider...

Habakkuk 2:1-4

Where there is no vision, the people perish... Proverbs 29:18a

I (Habakkuk – the Visionary) will stand upon my watch, and set me upon the tower, and will watch to see what he will say unto me, and what I shall answer when I am reproved. 2 And the LORD answered me, and said, Write the vision, and make it plain upon tables, that he may run that readeth it. 3 For the vision is yet for an appointed time, but at the end it shall speak, and not lie: though it tarry, wait for it; because it will surely come, it will not tarry. 4 Behold, his soul which is lifted up is not upright in him: but the just shall live by his faith.

Vision

(Greek- *Chazowne*) to see, perceive, look, behold, prophesy, provide

Miriam-Webster – a supernatural appearance/occurrence that conveys a revelation. A thought, concept, or object formed by the imagination. The act of power of the imagination. A mode of seeing or conceiving.

*Inspiration from God by the Holy Spirit.



Every Ministry Needs Good Help!

Jesus needed help! (Matthew 9:36-38)

- > Moved by compassion. (v.36)
- > Called for Help (laborers). (v.37-38)
- **Commissioned others. (Matthew 10:1)**

The Church is that help! (Ephesians 4:2-16)

Good Help With A Burden For Ministry

The Church – the Called Out Ones of God, must be ready to minister or serve this present age.

- ➤ Burden something that is carried (a load, duty or responsibility); something oppressive or worrisome;. Burden flows out of that which <u>inspires</u> or <u>offends</u> to the point of <u>compassion</u>. (Matthew 9: 36, 14:14)
- ➤ Minister to give aid or <u>service</u> (Matthew 20:26-28)

- I. Help That Knows The Voice of God
 - If called to service every minister should hear the voice of God (be called) (Genesis 37:5-11,1 Samuel 3:1-10,Acts 6:1-3,Acts 13:1-3)
 - Usher, Choir Members, Kitchen Committee, Ministerial Staff, etc, ideally "anyone who serves".
 - Not out of tradition, strictly need, or boredom with no call to service

- 2. Help That Serves As Unto The Lord...
 - Has given themselves to the Lord (2 Corinthians 8:1-6,
 - Seeks to Glorify God not others.
 (Matthew 5:16, Colossians 3:18-25, Matthew 6:1-8)
 - Serves with right motives.
 (I Corinthians I 0:3 I, Matthew 6:1-8, James 4:3)
 - Serves without excuses. (Luke 9:57-62)



3. Help That Is Faithful

- Begins at the Pastor despite the people (Numbers 12:4-9)
- Won't be a hindrance or hurt the Body. (Proverbs 25:19)
- Faithfully servers the Pastor. (2 Kings 2:9-12)
- To the call of God. (John 6:37-40)
- Serious about his calling. (Matthew 24:42-51, Luke 2:48-50)



- 4. Help That Is Committed To Excellence
 - Realizes they serve a God of excellence (Genesis 1:31, Exodus 3:8, Revelation 4:3-6)
 - Realizes they were created to walk excellence

(Ephesians 2:10, Genesis 9:6, Psalm 139:14)

Realizes "average" isn't good enough. (Colossians 4:12, I Kings 10:1-7)



- 4. Help That Is Committed To Excellence
- Always gives God their best. (Philippians 2:13, 3:5-12)
 - Chooses to be excellent. Exodus 32:26, Deuteronomy 30:19, Joshua 24:15, Isaiah 1:16-20)

- Is just that, diligently committed to excellence.
 - Not lazy Proverbs 13:4
 - Not wasteful Proverbs 10:4
 - Not slack in business –Proverbs 12:24

- 5. Help That Has The Leader's Spirit
 - Has been called to follow by God. (Numbers 11:17-18)
 - That submits to the Anointing on the Pastor (Numbers 25-26)
 - Is faithful to the Pastor's heart (Vision) (I Samuel 14:7)

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Where Do We Go From Here?

- Discover Your Purpose
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Purpose

... something set up as an object or end to be attained. The original intent of a thing (product); intention:

> Intention - what one intends to bring about

Product

...something that is produced; a commodity:

Commodity – something that is useful or valued

Purpose addresses why a thing (product) was created and how it is to be used if it is to meet its original intent. So, one must get into the mind of the Creator in order to determine the purpose or original intent of His creation (product).

Purpose & Product

Consider Man-Genesis 1:26-28

Creator - God

Product – Man

Purpose – Have dominion, Be fruitful, multiply and replenish the earth

Purpose & Product

Purpose address why a thing (product) was created and how it is to be used if it is to meet its original intent. So, one must get into the mind of the Creator in order to determine the purpose or original intent of His creation (product).

Consider The Church – Ephesians 2:10

Creator – His (God v. 4)

Product – We, the Workmanship (The Church)

Purpose - Created in Christ Jesus to walk in good works

Spiritual Gifts Support Purpose

God placed within the Church everything it needs to fulfill it's purpose.

Ephesians 4:11-13

11 And he gave some, <u>apostles</u>; and some, <u>prophets</u>; and some, <u>evangelists</u>; and some, <u>pastors</u> and <u>teachers</u>; 12 For the perfecting of the saints, for the work of the ministry, for the edifying of the body of Christ: 13 Till we all come in the unity of the faith, and of the knowledge of the Son of God, unto a perfect man, unto the measure of the stature of the fullness of Christ:

Spiritual Gifts Support Purpose

- **Romans 12:5-8**
- 1. Gift of Prophesy to prophesy with the idea of foretelling future events pertaining esp. to the kingdom of God. To prophesy speak forth by divine inspirations, to predict.

Purpose is to Edification, Exhortation, and Comfort

2. <u>Gift of Ministry</u> - to provide <u>service</u> within the Body of Christ.

A <u>Minister</u> or <u>Servant</u> is one who attends or waits on another.

Spiritual Gifts Support Purpose

- **Romans 12:5-8**
- 3. Gift of Teaching to impart instruction to the Body of Christ. To literally, pour out of you into someone else.
- 4. Gift of Exhortation -: to call to one's side, call for, summon (an act or instance of exhorting/language intended to incite and encourage). To Exhort to incite by argument or advice: urge strongly, to give warnings or advice : make urgent appeals

Spiritual Gifts Support Purpose

≻Romans 12:5-8

5. <u>Gift of Giving</u> -: to give, to give something to someone of one's own accord to give one something; to his advantage; to bestow a gift; to grant, give to one asking, let have; to supply or furnish necessary things

With Simplicity – simple; without pretense or guile

6. Gift of Ruling: to set or place before; to set over; to be over, to superintend, preside over

With Diligence – haste, earnestness in accomplishing, promoting or striving after a thing

7. Gift of Mercy: to have mercy on, to help one afflicted or seeking aid Compassionate treatment of those is distress; compassion or forbearance shown especially to an offender or one subject to one's power

Spiritual Gifts Support Purpose

➤ I Corinthians 12: 1-11

According to our passage, there are three categories, according to function, of spiritual gift:

1. Revelation Gifts – Word of Wisdom, Word of

Knowledge, Discerning of Spirits

- 2. Power Gifts Gift of Faith, Healing, Working of Miracles
- 3. Inspirational Gifts Prophecy, Tongues, Interpretation of Tongues

- > I Corinthians 12: 8 & 10d
 - 1. Revelation Gifts Word of Knowledge
 - * Revelation God's showing of a spiritual insight to man or mankind
- ➤ <u>Word of Knowledge</u> the revealing of a fact in existence that can only be supernaturally revealed. It cannot be know or seen naturally. (<u>Knowing Fact</u>)

- > I Corinthians 12: 8 & 10d
 - 2. Revelation Gifts Word of Wisdom
 - * Revelation God's showing of a spiritual insight to man or mankind
- ➤ <u>Word of Wisdom</u> the application of knowledge through wisdom, broad and full of intelligence; used of the knowledge of very diverse matters under the Anointing of God. (<u>Applying the Fact</u>) (Joseph-Gen 41:17-32, Paul-Acts 23 1:11)

- > I Corinthians 12: 8 & 10d
 - 3. Revelation Gifts Discerning of Spirits
 - *Revelation God's showing of a spiritual insight to man or mankind
- ➤ <u>Discerning of Spirits</u> the comprehending of the human spirit, supernaturally revealed by the Holy Spirit. It is not discerning of demons, but the human spirit both good and bad. Helps you to see the truth. (Solomon, I Kings 3:9, Malachi 3:18, Hebrews 5:14)

Spiritual Gifts Support Purpose

- > I Corinthians 12: 9-10a
 - 1. Power Gifts Gift of Faith

Power - indicative of might, strength, force - that which cause something to happen. (Dunamis, and exousia or legitimate authority or power.)

<u>Gift of Faith</u> – a extraordinary spirit of conviction of the truth of anything, belief (2 Corinthians 4:8-18, Hebrews 10:19-39)

Spiritual Gifts Support Purpose

- > I Corinthians 12: 9-10a
 - 2. Power Gifts Gift of Healing

Power - indicative of might, strength, force - that which cause something to happen. (Dunamis, and exousia or legitimate authority or power.)

<u>Gift of Healing</u> – God's work through instruments and ways He chooses to bring health (wholeness) to persons sick physically, emotionally, and spiritually. (<u>Jesus</u>-Spoke - Luke 17:14, Touch - Mark 5:27 <u>The Disciples</u> - Matt 10:5-10, The Church – James 5:14-16)

Spiritual Gifts Support Purpose

- > I Corinthians 12: 9-10a
 - 3. Power Gifts Gift of Working of Miracles

Power - indicative of might, strength, force - that which cause something to happen. (Dunamis, and exousia or legitimate authority or power.

Gift of Working of Miracles — a supernatural intervention by God through a person, animal or some other instrument, into the ordinary course of nature. Miracles are manifest when the intangible power of God affects the tangible, material world to cause a desired effect on behalf of God's people. (Person Use: Issue of blood healed, Matthew 9:20-22. Samson kills a lion Judges 14:5-6. Animal Use: Balaam's ass speaks, Numbers 22:28. Instrument Use: Healing by the brazen serpent, Numbers 21:8,9. Paul and Silas delivered, Acts 16:25-26.)

Spiritual Gifts Support Purpose

- > I Corinthians 12: 1-11
 - 1. Inspirational Gifts Prophecy

Gift of Prophecy - a discourse emanating from divine inspiration and declaring the purposes of God, whether by reproving and admonishing the wicked, or comforting the afflicted, or revealing things hidden; esp. by foretelling future events (Joel 2:28 – Acts 2:17-18, I Corinthians 14:1-5, 29--

For Edification, Exhortation, and Comfort

- **➤ I Corinthians 12: 1-11**
 - 2&3. Inspirational Gifts Tongues & Interpretation of Tongues
 - Gift of Tongues/Interpretation of Tongues 3 Types of Tongues in scripture according to Act 2 and Paul's teaching in I Corinthians 14.
- **Tongue 1 Human language (Acts 2-4, v.11)**
- Tongue 2 Tongues from God Requires Interpretation of Tongue (What was spoken) (I Cor 14:4-5, 26-28)
- Tongue 3 Tongues the Private Prayer Language (I Cor 13:1, I Cor 14:2)

Discovering Your Burden

- Your Burden coupled with spiritual gifting births excellent ministry.
- ➤ Burden something that is carried (a load, duty or responsibility); something oppressive or worrisome;. Burden flows out of that which <u>inspires</u> or <u>offends</u> to the point of <u>compassion</u>. (Matthew 9: 36, 14:14)

Woman At the Well

John 4:4-26

Encountered Jesus (v. 7)

Realized Her Unworthiness (v. 9)

Receives Revelation (v. 11, 13, 14, 18)

Recognizes Jesus' Power (v.19-25)

Ministers (v. 29)
